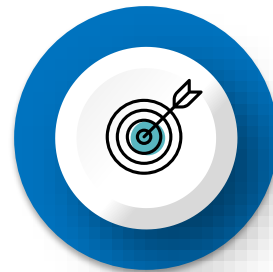

- **Method** - quantitative
- **Tools** - questionnaire made via “Google forms”
- **Type of sampling** - random sampling
 - Main conglomerate (2020-2021) N=1123
 - Sample size n= 157
 - Main conglomerate (2021-2022) N=845
 - Sample size n= 182



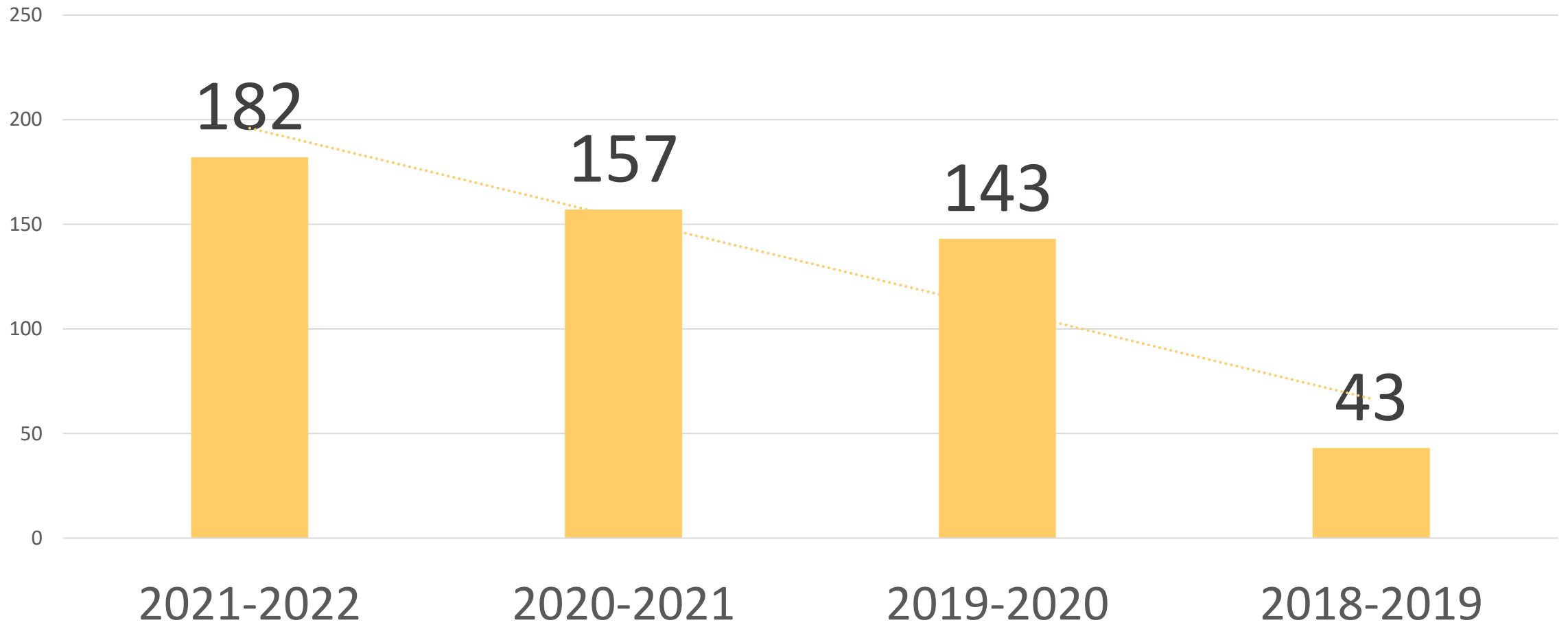

RESEARCH FINDINGS: STATISTICS



The number of graduates who participated in the survey by academic year



2018-2019 academic year

Number and percentage of employed graduates who participated in the survey	35	81,3%
Number and percentage of unemployed graduates who participated in the survey	8	18,7%

2019-2020 academic year

Number and percentage of employed graduates who participated in the survey	94	65,7%
Number and percentage of unemployed graduates who participated in the survey	49	34,3%

2020-2021 academic year

Number and percentage of employed graduates who participated in the survey	118	75,1%
Number and percentage of unemployed graduates who participated in the survey	39	24,9%

2021-2022 academic year

Number and percentage of employed graduates who participated in the survey	126	69,3%
Number and percentage of unemployed graduates who participated in the survey	56	30,7%

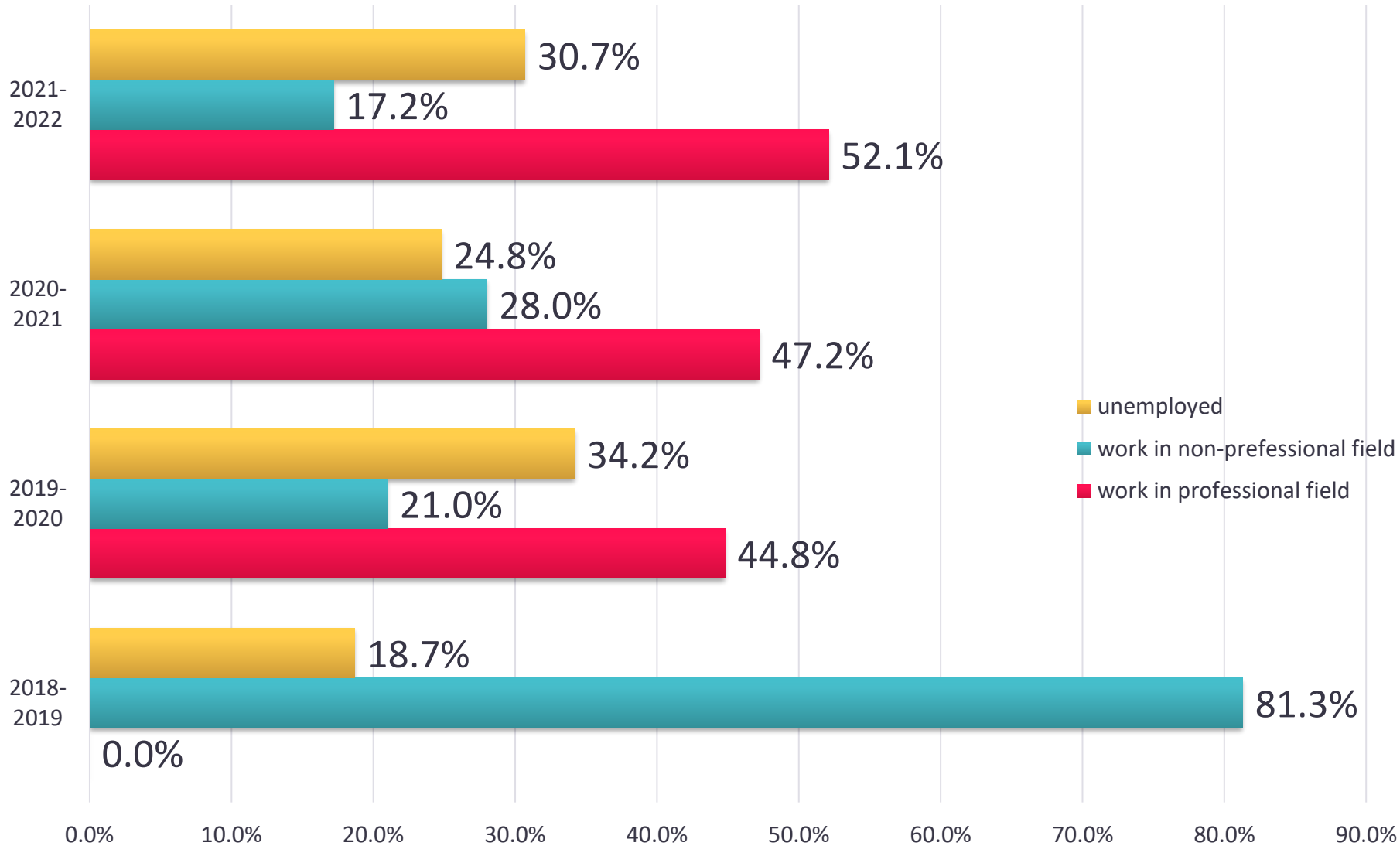


During the 2021-2022 academic year, the number of unemployed graduates who participated in the survey was 30.7%.

4.2% of the participants later joined the army, and the rest did not continue their education.

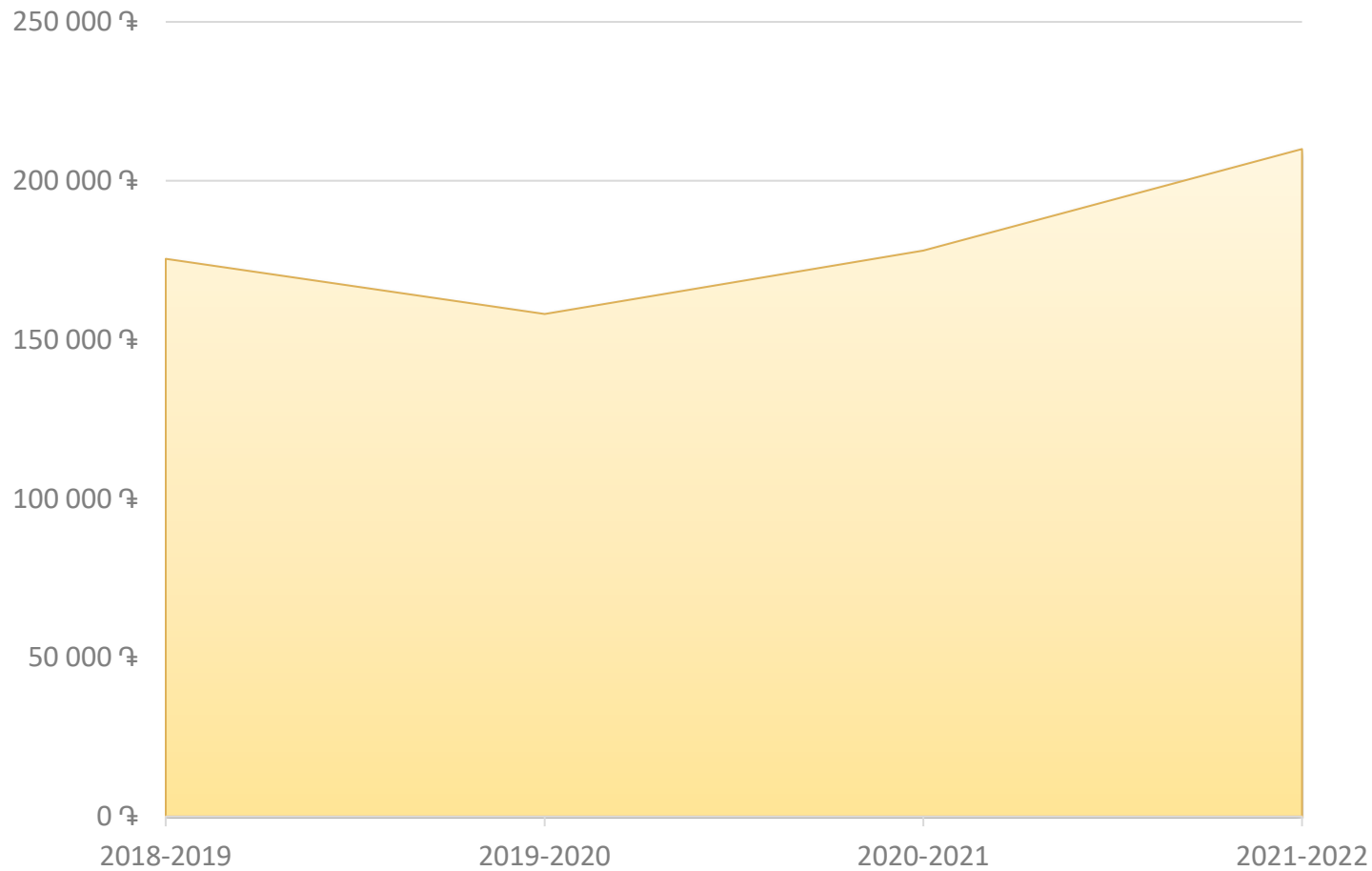


Areas of productivity of employed graduates professional or non-professional



As we can see in this graph, during these four academic years, the percentage of employed graduates who work in the professional fields has gradually increased.

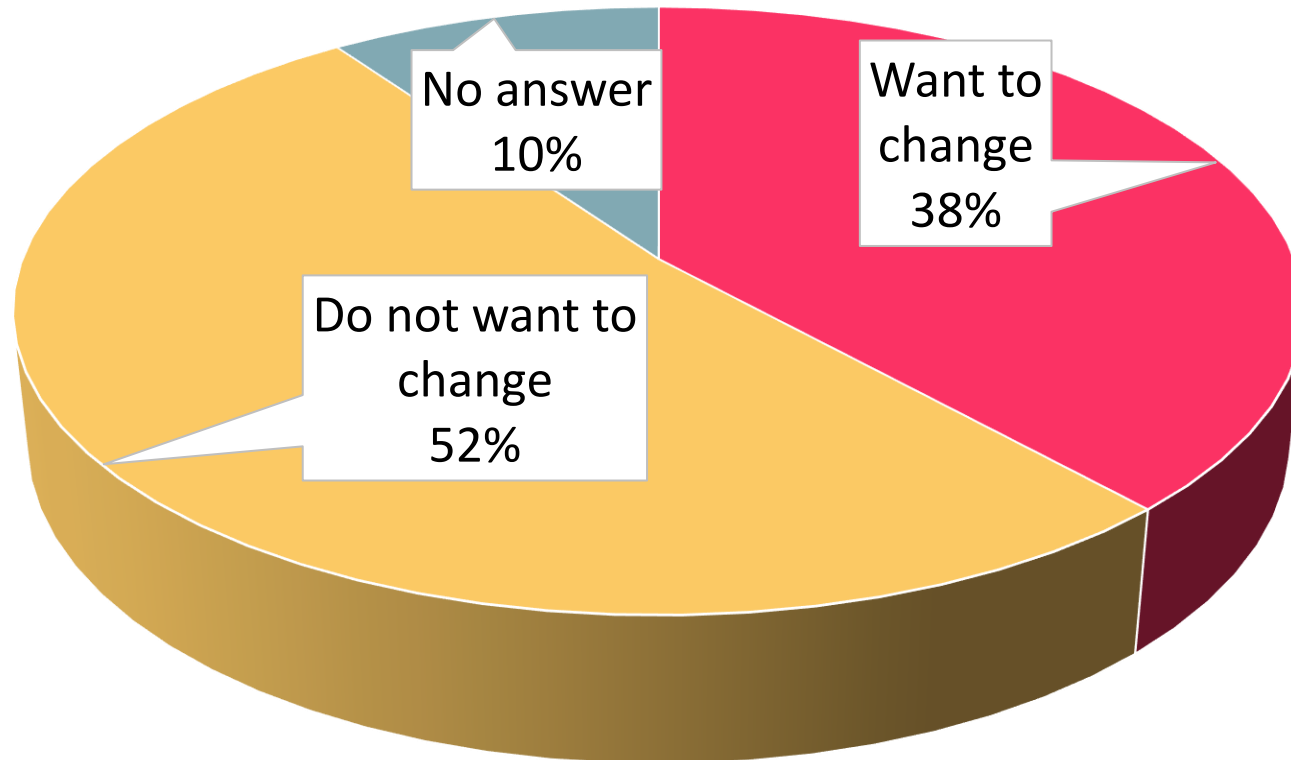
Graduates' average salary in AMD
